

## SAILING ON PISCATAQUA

You and your students are about to embark on a unique educational experience, under sail on our traditional wooden barge. You'll be engaged in learning through hands-on activities, adventure based education and quiet observation, and will work as a team to set the sail and help navigate the vessel. What you should know:

- The Coast Guard-certified *Piscataqua* sails the tidal waters of the Piscataqua Region
- A licensed captain and onboard educator will be in charge of your trip
- The program is designed for one class; a second class can be engaged in shore-based activity
- Students will rotate through hands-on learning stations led by trained educators
- Activities are correlated with state frameworks and learning results.

What to expect:

- Students engaged at hands-on learning stations during a 2.5 hour sail
- Quiet time for observation, journaling, and/or sketching
- Team work to set the sail and steer the boat
- Activities that encompass a variety of learning styles
- A renewed enthusiasm for learning

What you can do:

- Discuss the agenda and logistics with your class
- Bring a completed permission form for each student
- Divide your class into **three** small groups before you arrive
- Remind your students about dressing for the weather
- Have students use the Park bathrooms before sailing

What to bring:

- Permission forms
- Sunscreen
- Reusable water bottle
- Raingear
- Hats, mittens, jackets

What to wear:

- Warm clothes (long pants, sweatshirts, socks)
- Removable layers of clothing
- Rubber-soled shoes, NO sandals

What to leave at home

- Electronics (including cell phones)
- Food and gum
- Flip-flops, sandals, clogs
- Umbrellas

### \* IMPORTANT REMINDERS \*

*It is typically cooler on the water!  
Make certain students dress for a  
boat ride, not for a day at school.*

*Cell phones should be left on the bus  
or collected before sailing  
so students are not distracted  
and items are not lost overboard.*
